Searching in Safari

- Go to webpage
- Type search criteria in URL line
- Choose "Find in page"
- Arrows at bottom will find next and previous search

Hide private photos from view

• To hide photos, open your Photos app and tap Select in the upper right-hand corner. Next, tap the photos you want to hide and select the Share button from the bottom left of the screen (it looks like a box with an arrow coming out). Select Hide from the menu that appears at the bottom of your screen.

Go to the top of any web page

• This one is simple: When you're neck-deep in a website, tap the title bar of the app or web page. This one motion will send you zooming right back to the top. Since it was designed to make browsing easier, All you need to do is touch the black bar at the top of your display (where the time shows), and you'll find yourself at the very beginning.

Charge your iPad faster

- It's no secret that iPads can take a long time to charge. But there's a reason for this: the battery is massive. iPads require this large core in order to power that gorgeous display properly.
- Even still, there is a way to get your iPad in fighting shape much faster than usual. Apple's USB-C charging block is designed for its laptops, but with a lightning adapter, your iPad can enjoy increased charging speeds with zero additional effort.
- Just drop your iPad on the USB-C charger and give it a go. You'll be back to green in no time.

Use the new Scroll Bar

 When you're scrolling a webpage in Safari, a new Scroll Bar shows up on the right side of the screen. Only instead of just being a handy way to see where you're at on a page, you can now use it to scroll faster. Try it out by starting to scroll on a page, then long-press on the scroll bar and drag it up or down. The faster you drag, the faster Safari will scroll.

Search your iPhone with your voice

Anywhere you find a search bar in Apple's own apps, you'll notice there's now a microphone
on the far-right side. Tap on the new icon to enter your search query by voice, instead of
having to type it out.

Long screenshots of websites

- If you've ever had to take multiple screenshots of a webpage in order to capture the text of an article, you'll be happy to know that iOS 13's screenshot tool has a new trick. Open Safari and take one screenshot of any website and immediately tap on the thumbnail preview. Above the screenshot will be two options: Screen and Full Page.
- The feature works in Safari, Pages, Numbers, Keynote, Mail, or Apple Maps.
- Selecting Full Page will turn the entirety of the webpage you're viewing into a PDF file that you can then crop, annotate and save to the Files app.

Receive notifications via camera flash

- Those of you who prefer a visual phone alert to an audible one will like this: You can get your iPhone's flash to blink several times whenever you receive a notification.
- To get the feature working, go into Settings and tap Accessibility. Then, enter Audio/Visual and switch the LED Flash for Alerts toggle switch to "on." If you'd prefer to not be disturbed at all when the phone is in silent mode, you can tell the flash not to light up then.

How to use a mouse with an iPad

 You'll need a Bluetooth mouse if you want to connect it to your iPad. Open Settings > Tap on Bluetooth > Make sure your mouse's Bluetooth is turned on > Select the mouse from the Other Devices section > Follow the pairing instructions.

How to scan a document with Notes

- Launch the Notes app.
- Tap the New Note button in the lower right.
- Hit the (+) icon to add an attachment to the note. (This is how you add images or sketches to notes.)
- Choose Scan Documents from the list that pops up.
- Line up the document you wish to scan in the view.
- You'll see a yellow rectangle over the document, and if you hold your iPhone or iPad steady, it should take the photo automatically. If not, you can press the shutter button.
- The scan will move down to the lower left; you can tap it to see how it came out, and then press Done or Retake at the top of the screen.
